# ALABAMA SCORECARD

THE 2024 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

**As** Alabamians struggled under the weight of crippling inflation, their representatives chose to increase state spending and grow the Montgomery bureaucratic machine. While the Legislature passed some good bills like the School Choice bill and the bill to End Home Equity Theft, these bills still had flaws that undermine the principles of liberty. The RINO supermajorities also rubber-stamped reauthorization of anti-liberty regulatory bureaucracies and advanced at least three local tax increases, and one statewide tax increase. They are failing small government conservatives.

Alabama enjoys total Republican control of state government with supermajorities in both chambers of the Legislature. This should mean that conservative principles dominate the political landscape, but weak-kneed politicians buckle to crony interest groups and major corporations that trample our liberty and fail to limit the size and scope of the government in Montgomery.
