2024 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

This legislative session broke the camel's back in South Dakota. For too long, RINOs have made egregious votes that went against the values of their constituents. Now the dam has burst.

South Dakota is a Republican supermajority State. The party platform supports what we have been pushing: gun rights, property rights, and educational freedom. In arrogance, RINOs voted against pro-liberty legislation for years because they do not politically fear us. **We never faltered. We pushed clean pro-liberty legislation even if it was only to separate the wheat from the chaff.**

Eminent Domain Repeal

Our courageous Hazlitt Members in the State House forced a vote on **CLEAN** eminent domain repeal for Green New Deal carbon capture pipelines. It died in the House. In the wake of this betrayal, we saw the biggest primary sweep in recent history with 13 RINOs losing their seats.

Hazlitt Members from both Chambers voted to kill compromise bill SB 201 which destroys the ability of local governments to resist the Green New Deal land grab.

School Choice

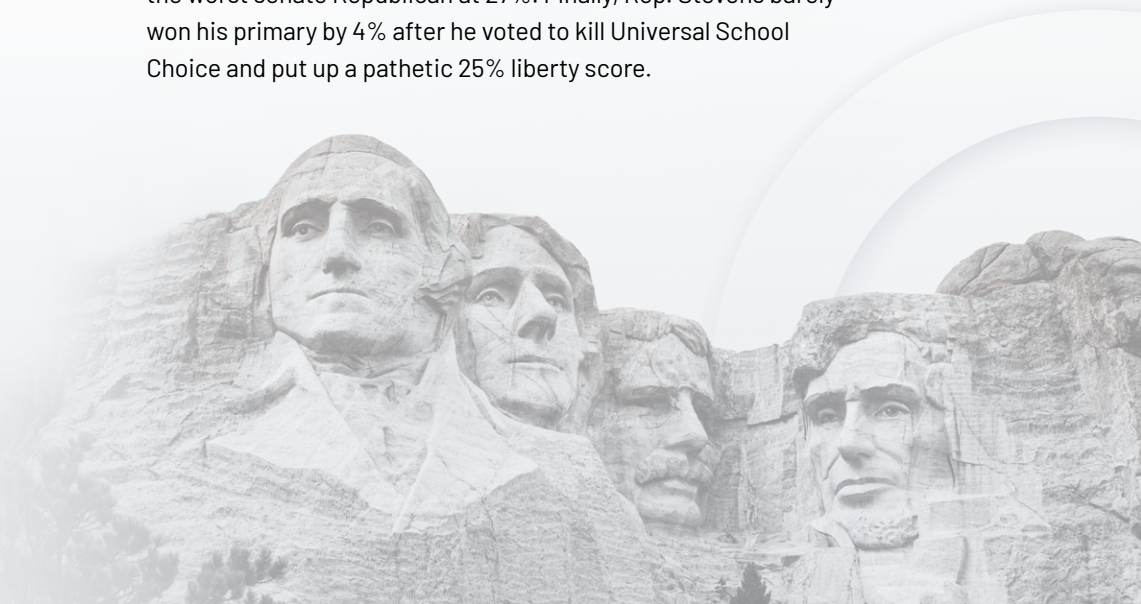
For the first time, we forced a floor vote on clean ESA School Choice legislation. Instead of coming to an agreement with the Public School Lobby, we listened to the Grassroots. The result of this forced vote is an inferno of enthusiasm for School Choice. We will not compromise, we will tell the politicians what we demand rather than telling the Grassroots what we must settle for.

Tyrants Water the Tree of Liberty

The betrayal of RINO House members and the inaction of RINO Senate members spurred a grassroots revolution in South Dakota that would not have been possible without the recorded votes that we forced and the courageous stances that our Hazlitt Members took, even if they were the only ones doing so.

Hall of Shame

There are several RINO legislators that disappointed the grassroots. Brookings Rep. Degroot, who made the motion to kill Universal School Choice, scraped the bottom of the barrel scoring 19% - the same as a lowest scoring Democrat. This led to him almost losing his primary with voters signally he's on borrowed time. Sen. Reed from the same area, the Local Government Committee chair who voted for preempting local control with bills like SB201, was the worst senate Republican at 27%. Finally, Rep. Stevens barely won his primary by 4% after he voted to kill Universal School Choice and put up a pathetic 25% liberty score.
