

his year was a breakout year for Liberty in Louisiana.
With a Republican Governor for the first time since 2016,
36 freshman House members, and 11 new Senators,
Louisiana was ready for change.

The year started with the Governor's inauguration speech calling for School Choice, Constitutional Carry, and making Louisiana a state where the next generation wants to stay instead of fleeing for a better life.

But the very next day, the supermajority Republican Senate unanimously elected a Radical Liberal Democrat as their President Pro-Tempore.

The politicians in Baton Rouge calling this a "do nothing position" and a sign of "bipartisanship" was a massive red flag to the citizens of Louisiana who had just months before voted overwhelmingly to make the state more Liberty-focused.

Governor Landry called two extraordinary sessions before the regular session began. American Action Fund collected a few large wins for Liberty during the special sessions including closed primaries for Louisiana Congressional and Senate candidates and the major victory of the year, Constitutional Carry!

After years of AAF mobilizing grassroots pressure and securing the important legislation in every neighboring state, American Action Fund pushed one of the cleanest Constitutional Carry bills in the nation into law in Louisiana.

Once the regular session began, AAF continued the momentum and fought for more transformational Liberty legislation. Allied legislators in AAF's Hazlitt Coalition authored bills ranging from Homeschool Freedom to Eminent Domain Reform, to Occupational License Reciprocity.

However, members of the anti-Liberty establishment dug their feet in catering to leftist influence despite the Republican trifecta. And unsurprisingly, the Senate whose members unanimously voted for Democrat leadership was largely responsible for killing conservative priorities.

This regular session saw its fair share of liberty bills passed but **it is not** all sunshine in the Bayou State. The RINO establishment push to increase fees, create new government programs, and block bills that would give citizens more rights in their educational and medical choices is a sign we still have work to do to make Louisiana a Lighthouse State for Liberty.

Hall of Shame

Several RINO legislators proved to be very disappointing and problematic for the liberty movement. Rep. Cox, Rep. Boyd, and Rep. Fontenot are all "Republican" Legislators who helped to pass a Democrat-sponsored Gun Control bill out of committee. Senator Kirk Talbot punched his RINO card by sponsoring SB419, which would have banned Constitutional Carry in the French Quarter.

Finally, and worst of all, are Representatives Barbara Freiberg and Joe Stagni. These two Reps are the pinnacle of fake Republicans who only have an R next to their name during election season. These two Reps have proven themselves to be fiscally liberal gun grabbers whose greatest service to the people of Louisiana would be to leave politics for good.
